- Proposed number of 3,500 / 3950 houses is equivalent to a new town (the size of Pershore) without the necessary infrastructure agreed or indeed

planned. As and when it is proven that the site can sustain that number of homes, it would be foolish to consider such a development. In addition the land proposed is grade 2 agricultural land - which Government suggests we need to preserve in order to grow food, let alone the desecration of a currently rural and village culture. Finally the one aspect that is key to any development of size within this site must be accompanied by the completion of the ring road titled the NW link, which I understand is too expensive.

 It is not suitable because it is greenfield. Would mean too much traffic and greenfield lost. Strain on local infrastructure.

 Residents of Lower broadheath are not opposed to further housing within the village - indeed it would be welcomed. It is all a matter of volume. There are many sites within the village boundary e.g. on either side of Peachley Lane after current housing; an area bounded by Bell Lane(left side) and Martley Road (going towards Martley) which might accommodate 3-500 houses.
