

SOUTH WORCESTERSHIRE VILLAGES

Summary of marinas, moorings and boating facilities comments:

- River banks of Worcester could certainly be made more attractive to tourists.
- The River Severn is part of the identity and heritage of South Worcestershire.
- Tourists like to visit beautiful green places, tourist boating is fine but no more houses or else the tourists won't come here.
- Not only in the right locations but not allowed to become over developed and another blot on the landscape.
- Upton marina is a great boom in the area and Water Festival and Jazz weekend being much needed money to the area.
- Impact of boating on environment and capacity of rivers to cope is key. There are limits to what rivers can take. Boating needs to be sustainable.
- Though there should be a limit on size of marinas
- Marinas shouldn't be too big
- Good access from a main road would be required as large boats on vehicles may be moving on or off site.
- To minimise flood damage and loss of property.
- We already have these, so no more!
- The slipway is overgrown and inoperable and dangerous. It is also a much used fly tipping dump.
- More could be made of our riverside, similar to Pershore, Evehsam and Stratford.
- Again, leave it to private enterprise. If a place of beauty attracts people, their presence will encourage improvement to facilities.
- Again, the improvements to the Astley Burf moorings, once complete, will bring much needed revenue to the "Hampstall Inn" and help develop the site further, for recreational facilities.
- The river Seven and the Canal System provide good boating facilities and marinas flourish
